He encouraged us to see the work of classis as part of the ongoing victory of God's kingdom. Classis was formally called to order and Chair Rev. Brian Kuyper extended a welcome to all the delegates and to visitors.

Rev. Martin Boardman has received a call from the Brooks congregation to serve as Prayer Mobilizer with Presbyterian Reformed Ministries International. He will report to the Brooks council every two months in the area of life and doctrine, with the supervision of duties and

compensation coming from PRMI. Classis is required to approve this position as being consistent with the calling of a minister of the Word as per Church Order Article 12-c. Martin will continue as prayer coordinator for classis.

6.4 Classical Treasurer's Report. Jerry Borst reporting. Update of 2016 budget. Budgeted amount: \$190,560. Income to date: \$108,000 – 57%. Expenses to date: \$154,000 -81%. Deficit (\$35,500). 6 of the 18 churches have not made a contribution to the 2016 budget.

- 6.6 Classical Ministry Leadership Team. See written report. Rev. Paul Verhoef reporting. He shared about the four roles of the CMLT: to encourage churches to seek out members who are investigating a call into ministry, to walk alongside of those students, to support them financially, and to remind churches to pray for and celebrate these students. He then shared about our four current students that we support: Cari Fydirchuk, Evelyn Eisses, Steven Vandyk, and Rafik Kamel. The first three sent emails of gratitude, and Rafik was able to be present and share his thanks in person. Paul thanked the classis for their faithful support of these four students, and invited the congregations of ABSS to pray for them.
- **6.7 Classical Safe Church Ministry.** Rev. David Swinney reporting. M/S to replace the safe church team with Elza Bouman appointed as Coordinator. Elza addressed classis briefly on legal liability and the need for local church policies, including police checks for staff and volunteers. She entertained several questions.
- **6.8 Classical Campus Ministry Team.** See report attached to Agenda. Rev. Paul Verhoef and Pearl Nieuwenhuis reporting. They reported on many pieces of their work, following the various roles of a chaplain: Chaplain as Loving Presence, as Worship Leader, as Host, as Catalyst of Christian Thought, as Advocate and as Ambassador. Pearl also shared a little about her specific work as a Spiritual Director on campus. They expressed gratitude for the trust in sending them, for the prayers that hold them, and the mission that calls them.
- **6.9 Classical Prayer Coordinator Report.** Rev Martin Boardman reporting. Keep praying! He is available to assist churches in developing prayer ministries.
- **6.10 Church Visitor Team Reports**. Team 1: visited Bethel, Saskatoon in November 2015. Met separately with Rafik Kamel and Ron Smeding; Sonlight, Regina and Berta Adema (IMCF). Team 2: No report. Team 3: No report. Team 4. Iron Springs (April), Taber (May). Team 5: Granum.
- 6.11 Regional Pastor's Report.
 - **6.11.1** Rev. Jake Corvers reported on two visits. Rev. George Koopmans thanked Jake for his years of faithful service, prayed for him and presented him with a Tim Horton's gift card.
 - **6.11.2 M/S** that Rev. Martin Boardman be appointed as regional pastor. **CARRIED**
- **6.12 Faith Formation Committee Report.** Rev. Matt Vanden Heuvel reporting. Sid Hielema and Ron de Vries will be at High River CRC November 25, beginning with dinner at 6:30 pm. Ellen Brekeridge (nee Lyzenga) is still youth ministry champion, but no longer serving on the committee, as she has married a Baptist and is no longer active in a CRC congregation. There have been conversations with the Home Missions Committee about cooperating in their respective roles of growing spiritually (deeper) and numerically (wider).

He spoke about "Our Journey 2020" ministry plan (church & community, discipleship, leadership, identity) available in handouts and also online. He also showed videos of local churches modelling the goals of the ministry plan. "It's all about the local church!"
 - **8.5 World Missions.** See report attached to Agenda. Cora Rempel reporting. She shared the story of "Walking with West Africa." World Missions and Home Missions are being merged into a new missions agency by the end of June, 2017.

He thanked the delegates to Classis for their ongoing support and noted that the support of Classis Alberta South and Saskatchewan was a critical factor in keeping this ministry going after the transition from the original Salaam Project. Greg noted ministry events such as the Refugee Roundtable, a panel discussion at Redeemer UC and ongoing work in Montreal through Mission Montreal. Greg also highlighted an upcoming conference for the Canadian Network of Ministries to Muslims in Toronto. He is on the national leadership team of CNMM. There are 19 local network groups across Canada (including Calgary, Edmonton, Saskatoon and Regina). Greg is available to the churches for consulting on ministry to Muslims.

- **10.4 Overtures Committee**: Rev. Rich Braaksma reporting. Advisory committee recommended that classis not accede. Al Brander was given the floor to speak on behalf of the overture. **M/S/C** to divide the motion into two parts.

- M/S to instruct the clerk of classis to withdraw the legal authority of all persons registered to perform marriages under the auspices of Classis Alberta
 South/Saskatchewan of the Christian Reformed Church in North America, and not to register any person to perform such services in the future.

- 2. **M/S** to overture the 2017 Synod of the Christian Reformed Church in North America to adopt this as a matter of denominational policy, instructing all governing bodies of the CRC to withdraw the legal authority to perform marriages on the basis of ordination in the Christian Reformed Church. **DEFEATED.**
- **11.** The concept minutes were reviewed by Medicine Hat delegates and the Classis executive.
- 12. Next Classis meeting to be held on March 31, 2017 at High River CRC.
- **13. Closing.** The chair thanked the delegates and Medicine Hat CRC for hosting the meeting. Rev. Henry Veldboom thanked the chair. The chair read Ephesians 3:20-21, prayed and led in the singing of the doxology.
